Course Overview

At the core of the traditional Buddhist path are the three wheels - Shila, Samadhi and Prajna. The Indo-Tibetan Buddhist system of education expands the three wheels into five topics or areas of study: gaining certainty in the view (Madhyamaka); fully understanding the methods and stages of the path (Prajnaparamita as presented in the Abhisamayalamkara); sharpening the logical mind (Pramana); discriminating the elements of our experience (Abhidharma); and fully understanding the various precepts for practice (the Three Vows). The Shambhala Core Texts Program will present this wealth of material in segments spanning a number of years in weekly and weekend courses using materials that range from compendiums of the material, to the commentarial literature to finally the most profound, the actual root texts themselves.

The first series of courses will focus on the methods and stages of the path. The root text for this topic is *The Ornament of Higher Realization* by Maitreya as recorded by Noble Asanga. We will begin to the access this profound text through one of the most beautiful and comprehensive of the many compendiums of the bodhisattva path, *Treasury of Precious Qualities* by Jigme Lingpa (others include *The Jewel Ornament of Liberation* and *The Words of My Perfect Teacher*). This long work has been skillfully condensed into one volume by Kangyur Rinpoche and masterfully translated by the Padmakara Translation Group.
